#### Reminder for Parents - Leave Of Absence during Term Time

As you will all be aware current attendance regulations stipulate a headteacher may not grant a leave of absence during term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits. It is for the headteacher to decide what he/she views as 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. If the leave is granted the headteacher is able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent. Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice. Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s). Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued and not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996. Parents are asked to respect the new regulations under which the school must work and if there is a need to take a child out of school during term-time, an application or request must be made in advance and make clear how the circumstances are exceptional.

#### **Some facts:**

There are 190 school days each year and 175 other days for shopping trips, birthday treats, non urgent appointments and holidays.

One day a week absence is the equivalent over a school career of 2.5 whole years of education missed. Ten days holiday leave a year is the equivalent of two whole terms of education missed.

15 minutes of lateness a day equals one whole year of education missed.

#### In Case of Bad Weather

You can sign up to receive text alerts if the school has to close due to bad weather, or other emergency situations, at <a href="https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schoolclosures">www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schoolclosures</a>. Announcements will also be made on local radio stations. Please make sure we have your current mobile telephone numbers as we will additionally use the school text system to communicate with you if we have to close suddenly.

#### **Reading At Home**

I assessed again in January the number of children having their reading listened to at home on a regular basis. I can see that 71% of the children are reading regularly, that is three times a week. Do remember that reading is a skill that needs to be practiced regularly. Even though schools teach children how to read, parents still have an important role to play. Research shows that parents who get involved in their child's education make a big difference to how well their children do. You can help your child with reading by showing how important it is and by finding ways to help them enjoy reading. Studies also show that children who enjoy reading do much better at school. Spend 10 minutes a day reading together. Make it fun – choose books you both enjoy. Talk about the pictures and characters and make up your own stories. And you don't have to limit yourself to books, try reading comics, look at newspapers together and point out more unusual words. Thank you for your continued support.
