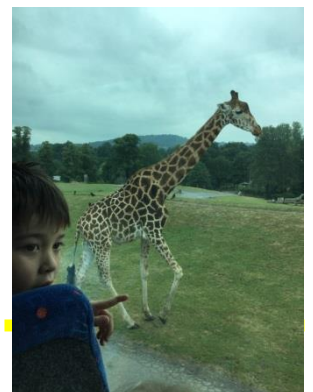


Tokens for Emscote at Tesco

We will be celebrating the end of term and saying goodbye to Year 2 with a church service at All Saints' Church.

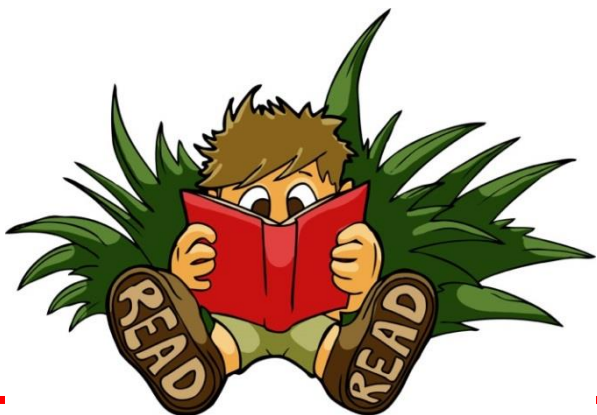
